## Spring to it

Metung Hot Springs has opened for business, placing the tiny town of Metung in East Gippsland on the luxury bathing trail map. Rachel and Adrian Bromage and Charles Davidson, of Peninsula Hot Springs, have joined forces to develop the architecturally designed complex, aided by enerous tourism grants. "The health and wellbeing space is one of the fastest growing tourism industries in the world," says Adrian.

Geothermal water, discovered here in the 1930s by a company drilling for oil, bubbles up to fill the rock pools and giant barrels dotted throughout the resort. Paths wind through native vegetation leading to nooks and restful places to bask, bathe, breathe and take in the views Sit up to your neck in warm and healing water watching the boats glide by on Lake King.

Ten safari-style tents, oozing romance and style, offer interiors that generate gasps of delight. Earthy furnishings - timber four-poster beds, leather chairs and hand-crafted ceramic pendant lights – make up a colour palette of verdant green, ecru and rust, inspired by the surrounding bush. A pair of hot spring barrels sits on each private deck, enticing the lucky guests to hop in.
